### **What it Takes to be a Tutor...**

Teaching someone to improve their basic skills is an important and exciting opportunity. If you read well and enjoy working with others, you can become a tutor. We need volunteers that our students can depend on, committing to at least 2 hours a week without fail. All tutors must complete the required 20 hour training.

### **Training**

Training workshops are available each year providing you with twenty hours of training by certified instructors using a combination of Michigan Method and ProLiteracy Worldwide methods. There is no cost to the volunteer, and materials are provided.

### **Effective Tutoring Sessions**

Tutors meet with their students once or twice a week at either libraries, schools, community centers, or churches at mutually decided times. This is flexible and other arrangements can be made if agreed by both parties. Tutors have also worked in Adult Ed, Learning Centers and at the MIWorks offices.

### **Objective of Tutoring**

Tutors help students attain their personal goals, and the objective is dependent on the needs and aims of the student. The tutor first and foremost, needs to discover what the student wants to achieve, (read better, improve math, get a GED), and then design a learning plan to fit the student's needs.
